Program

She has been on the board for a little over 2 years. She was very excited to be asked to be part of the board. She has been the President since this past summer.



McFeaters introduced Chelsea Cooper (left), Executive Director, who has been with SASS for 4 years.

The organization has an advocacy-in-crisis program where client services are done, including using rape kits and Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) exams, there is a 24/7 hotline, case management, client assistance with financial assistance, and financial assistance with relocation, food, clothing, any needs a client may have that

the organization may provide help with. There is an outreach program, informing the community about the services and teaching safe gates which covers safe dating, healthy relationships, sexual assaults.

New to the agency this year there is a local safe house interviewer who interviews children if they were sexually assaulted, assaulted, or abused. It is very exciting to have them local to better assist their clients. There is a therapeutic counselor, and trauma-sensitive yoga is offered through the Lotus Center which starts today. SANE unit is being administered at La Clinica. SANE Exams are conducted to collect evidence, and these exams can be conducted even if they don't want to report an incident. They give about 2 SANE exams/month and about 12 clients come in for support services. There are more people coming forward about abuse that has happened in the past. All services are question-and-answer and are always confidential.

Cooper introduced Rusty Talley (right), one of the newer members to the board. He was previously affiliated with SASS as a law enforcement officer. He spoke about his experiences with SASS from his law enforcement experience and how survivors do not have the support from the criminal justice system; that is why it is important to have independent resources such as SASS.


Raffle
