1. Casa Soles de Anapra in Juarez:

- Needs a new roof, \$500.00: Peter Herzberg and Tom Bates may donate personally.
- Needs help with art classes, kitchen, AC, fence: they are asking for support at the level of \$1000 for this international project whose total cost is projected to be \$40,000.

2. Corazon de Nino (Children's hospital) in Juarez:

Needs help for open heart surgeries, neonatal, cancer, birth defects, etc: they are seeking support at the level of \$2,000.

3. Children's Hospital Blood bank in Juarez:

Needs help with storage and transport: they are seeking support at the level of \$1,000.

4. Health Care Center in Chihuahua:

This international project is seeking help at the level of \$1,000 to furnish a clinic for a Tarahumara Indian community.

5. Solar Project in Juarez:

Solar panels/electricity to 175 families at a cost of \$200.00 per family: This is an international project for which we are being asked to contribute \$1,000.

Jim Reynolds made a motion and **Peter Falley** seconded it to give \$1000.00 each to the Corazon de Ninos (open heart surgeries) and to the Tarahumara Health Care Center. The motion carried.
