Rotary Announcements

Peter Herzberg made a number of announcements:

- There will be a meeting of the Membership Committee directly following next week's regular club meeting.
- Come say hello to Anita Larson on Sunday, January 27, at the Little Toad.
- The Valentine's Dinner is on the February 9 at the Bear Mountain Lodge. The cost is \$70 per person,
 of which \$25 will be a charitable donation to the Silver City Rotary Foundation. The beneficiary of
 the event is the New Mexico Land Conservancy. Sign-up sheets were passed around.
- The February 1 event with **RI President Barry Rassin**, in addition to the evening gala, will involve a breakfast/brunch in Juarez. A bus will be provided by the Camino Real Rotary Club to take people over to Juarez. **Rosie Higgs** urged club members to consider going to that event, since it is bound to be a lot of fun.
- **Peter Herzberger** and **Rosie Higgs** gave an update on the condition of Jane Bates. She is no longer sedated and is able to breathe on her own, but she is not very responsive yet. She is expected to be transferred to a rehab facility, probably in Bayard, shortly.
- **Sunny Kellerman** announced that there has been substantial progress in the project to get books to Kindergarteners. She still has books that have to get out to the schools, and there is money in the budget for possibly two more book orders.

- **Sunny Kellerman** also told us that she has been informed that she is one of only 3 candidates for the District Governor Elect and District Governor Elect Nominee positions. There will be interviews on January 31, and the selection process should come to a conclusion quite soon.
