Rotary Announcements

Suzanne Kavanagh made a number of announcements:

• She told us that **Rosie Higgs** had agreed to move up her club presidency to next year (2020-21), which means that, subject to the official club vote next week, she will be our President-Flect.

- **Jim Tindall** had a bad fall and broke a cervical vertebra. **Linda Telaak** told us that he is doing Ok, but that he'll be out of commission for a while.
- Helen Shoup sent a Thank You for her Get Well card.

Peter Falley made the following announcements:

- The WNMU Scholarship Committee decided to award two scholarships this year: \$500 to Jeffrey Arrington, who will be graduating in December and who was our sole scholarship recipient last year; and \$1,000 to Michelle Ynostroza. Both are in the Nursing Program.
- Several of us attended WNMU's Scholarship Luncheon on Monday: Leslie Bush, Cynthia Bettison, Jack Herndon and Peter F. Ashley Herndon was there too, but as a scholarship recipient. Unfortunately, our two scholarship winners did not show up.
- As we make scholarship awards, the Rotary Scholarship Fund at WNMU is being drawn down, and we need to make a point of replenishing it periodically.
- 21 high school students have started work on their scholarship applications. The deadline is March 15. Seven students have completed the applications and are in the process of submitting the required supporting documentation.
- The Membership Committee meeting Peter had tried to organize for Wednesday evening (3/6) had to be cancelled because a couple of key members of the committee had conflicts. He asked for the members of the committee to stay for a brief meeting after lunch to set a new date.
- The Silver City Rotary Foundation Board Meeting is scheduled for next week after lunch.

Sunny Kellerman told us that the book reading at 6th Street School and Cliff Elementary that she and **Francis Reyes**, **Peter Herzberg**, **Rosie Higgs** and **Bart Roselli** participated in along with **Becky Nell Young** and **Alicia Edwards** was great fun and was received enthusiastically by the kids.

Sunny also announced that we're not having any international Rotary Friendship Exchange this year, but internal U.S. Friendship Exchanges are becoming more popular. A Friendship Exchange group from Fredericksburg, TX, will be in our area July 8-16, and we'll need some people to host them if we want them to come to Silver City for 2 or 3 nights. **Kathy Eaton**, **Jim Reynolds** and **Sunny Kellerman** indicated that they might be able to take a couple of people each. (It turns out that the Fredericksburg group has been snapped up by another club. Perhaps the next one will come this way.)

Kate Watson announced that she has tickets for the annual District Raffle. The tickets are \$10 each and come in packets of 10. Kate is giving each club member one packet to either sell or buy on their own. Either way, the money produced for The Rotary Foundation by each member will count toward his or her Every Rotarian Every Year contribution and toward Paul Harris Fellowship points. The winner of the Raffle can either opt for a cruise or can take the money in cash, part of which will go to The Rotary Foundation. Ticket stubs with cash or

checks made out to The Rotary Foundation are due by April 16th. Members in attendance all eagerly accepted their ticket packets.

Program



Jason Burke told us that he heads up the Southwest Adolescent Group, which has opened a thrift shop, appropriately named SWAG, on Hudson Street opposite the Post Office. After the It Takes a Village program ended, a few people decided that the greatest need was to provide support services for adolescents and youths. The organization set out to have a free-standing youth center, which is now housed in the same building as the SWAG shop, but it still needs work. They would like the youth center to have activities, life skills, vocational workshops, and community service projects. The focus will be 12 to 17-year-olds. They're working with Aldo students to create a needs assessment survey to hand out to the kids. Right now they are doing a lot with basketball and Little League. They are also giving scholarships to kids who cannot afford these sports

for the equipment they need.

The SWAG shop accepts all kinds of items as long as they are in good condition. They cannot accept large items, such as mattresses or large box TVs.

Right now the SWAG shop is the only source of income for the program.
