## Program

Col. Susan Beck, ret., gave an overview of Military Flight Training areas over Southern New Mexico. She showed slides of current airspace regions and explained how current plans call for changes and expansions in these regions. Some of these changes would impact the Gila Wilderness and our immediate area. In some cases, low level training would allow for planes to fly as low as 100 feet above the ground. Some of the proposed changes have not been finalized. There has been substantial input provided by governmental and non-governmental entities in our area, and that input is being taken into consideration in the planning.
